<p>Infection from COVID-19</p>	<p>Anyone attending services</p>	<p>Guidelines have been revised to reflect the removal of legal restrictions in February. They are published on the noticeboard and website.</p> <p>We ask people not to attend if they have symptoms of COVID-19 but to get tested. Those who have tested positive should self-isolate at home.</p> <p>We encourage everyone to use the hand sanitiser.</p> <p>We respect those who wish to continue to wear face coverings or practice social distancing.</p> <p>The chairs have been rearranged with wider aisles and extra distance between rows to allow people to sit further apart than normal.</p> <p>We will open windows to increase air circulation whenever there are large numbers present.</p> <p>Sunday services will be broadcast on Skype for those unable to attend in person. An audio feed is provided to the rear hall for anyone who wishes to avoid being too close to others.</p>

		<p>Numbers will only be restricted by the number of seats set out. If there are more people than seats we will arrange to overflow into another area of the building.</p> <p>An additional exit through the vestry will be open for the preacher and front rows.</p> <p>Food preparation and service will be done by individuals who should wash their hands regularly and follow good practice in line with food hygiene standards</p> <p>Communion will be held in the normal manner but the bread will be placed on large platters and those serving will wear face coverings.</p>
